IHECS RELOCATES TO A NEW CAMPUS

After 36 years at its historic site in Brussels, IHECS is opening a **new chapter in its history**.

Starting in September 2026, **the school will relocate to its new campus in Schaerbeek** which is fully part of the Brussels-Capital Region. This means that IHECS is not leaving Brussels; it is simply moving to a new site within the city.

The relocation is part of a long-term development project designed to provide students and staff with **modern, high-quality** facilities better suited to the evolving communication and media professions. The new campus will be located in a **dynamic media district**, in immediate proximity to the Belgian national public broadcaster (RTBF&VRT), as well as **numerous audiovisual companies** and **media professionals active** in the field.

Teaching spaces, studios, production facilities, and student life areas **will be significantly upgraded** to support creativity, innovation, and hands-on professional practice. Being situated next to major media institutions and industry professionals will further **strengthen the connections** between academic training and the realities of the sector.

We would like to reassure our partners and prospective students of the following:

- All existing mobility agreements (Erasmus+ and other bilateral partnerships) **remain fully valid**.
- Course offerings for international students will be maintained, with the **same academic and pedagogical standards**.
- Reception and support services for incoming students will **continue without interruption**. Particular attention will be given to practical matters such as access, public transportation, housing, and on-campus services.

IHECS GRADING SCALE

ECTS GRADING SCALE	LOCAL GRADES - CONVERSION
A Excellent - outstanding performance without errors	$\leq 20 - \geq 17$
B Very good - above the average standard but with minor errors	$< 17 - \geq 15$
C Good - generally sound work with some errors	$< 15 - \geq 13$
D Satisfactory - fair but with significant shortcomings	$< 13 - \geq 11$
E Sufficient - performance meets the minimum criteria	$< 11 - \geq 10$
FX Fail - some work required before the credit can be awarded	$< 10 - \geq 8$
F Fail - considerable further work is required	< 8

Brief overview:

Students are assessed on a grading scale ranging from 0 to 20, with 0 representing the lowest possible score and 20 the highest. A score of 10 is regarded as the minimum passing grade; any mark below 10/20 is considered a failure.

Clarification Regarding the Transmission of Grades:

The grades have been transmitted exactly as received from the respective professors or course coordinators. They have not yet been subjected to formal deliberation, and students have not yet had the opportunity to retake failed components, in accordance with IHECS's standard academic procedures.

The Partner Institution is responsible for carrying out the deliberation process for its students. However, upon formal request, IHECS may conduct the deliberation of Erasmus students' results. Should this option be chosen, the Partner Institution must take into account that the final results will only be available after the next official deliberation session at IHECS (at the beginning of September).
